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PRESIDENT MOTTA: Good afternoon here on the East Coast. Good morning everywhere else. And I'm sorry I'm a little bit late, but we took advantage of that time to get our Credentials Report done, so Dyann is on my side calculating the votes so we'll give you that report as soon as she is done.

But before we get started, as we always do, let us have a moment of silence to remember all those in our soccer family, in our personal lives, friends, family, relatives that have passed since we have last met and remember them in a silent prayer.

(Moment of silence.)

PRESIDENT MOTTA: Thank you. As Dyann is prepping the Credentials Report I'm just going to give you my, you know, report and opening statement for USASA.

First of all, I want to welcome everyone that is virtually attending this meeting and a few of us in this room that are here together. Unfortunately, due to the circumstances, we were hoping to have everyone here live, but

because of the actions U.S. Soccer took of doing everything virtual and our Board decided to go the same way, many of you decided not to spend the money unnecessarily to be here in person where we can do this virtually, so I know and I think everybody on the computer will agree it's okay to get it done virtually, but it's definitely nothing that beats us being face to face and having a drink with each other and talking.

So let us pray that this is the last meeting that we are going to be doing this virtually and going forward we will be doing this face to face so we can enjoy each other's company. That's what I'm really hoping for.

So, let me begin by first congratulating all of our members. When the USASA Board of Directors met and we prepared the budget for last year, you know, COVID was still an uncertainty and when we made our budget we prepared a budget for 160,000 registered players.

As you know, the previous year we only had

like about 80,000, so we thought we would double the amount from 80 to 160, so that's what we based our budget on but, you know, you guys need to be really congratulated because of your hard work, your dedication and everything you've done in your states, in your leagues, in your national leagues, everyone collectively, we had 220,000 players registered last year which was 60,000 more than we budgeted that we were anticipating we were going to get, so I can't thank you enough for the hard work and everything you did to get us to the 220,000 player mark, so everyone here deserves a real big thank you.

Last year we all know we went through a very tough governance process, and you've heard me say this before, but for those that didn't, USASA had the largest target on our back during that whole governance process. We got attacked from almost every direction possible; the pros, the at-large members, they wanted pretty much to take away who USASA was, but with determination and the support of many

we prevailed and we ended up not losing anything.

We stayed with our two Board seats and we ended up with the same voting strength as the Youth and the Pro Council has at today,

20 percent. I mean, that wasn't an easy task and the one thing I will say, we had a great team there, you know, with Richard Moeller,

Janet Campbell, Roy Carlson, Kali Blackshear and Chaz Ballish, I mean, we were relentless.

We did not let them roll over USASA just like that so, you know, a great team, but I'd be remiss if I didn't also thank U.S. Youth Soccer for standing side by side with us through that entire process.

As I said before, I have never seen USASA and USYS so tightly connected as we were during that whole process, so if you know anybody that's involved with the youth association, thank them for the support that they gave us during that whole process.

This Governance Task Force, they're still continuing their work. It's still not over,

but their only task during this next session during this year, as you well know, is when we did the last Governance Task Force we agreed that the current structure of the U.S.

Soccer's Board of Directors will sunset at the AGM 2023 which is exactly a year from now, so if the Governance Task Force does not come up with a new board structure this year, next year's AGM we go back to the structure we had prior to this last Governance Task Force.

I don't think that will happen. I'm more than confident that the new Governance Task Force that will be working this year will agree and will make a proposal for a permanent U.S. Soccer Board of Directors.

You know, I am not on that task force now. I appointed three members which are Janet Campbell, Chaz Ballish and we also have Mike Cullina. Those are the three U.S. Adult Soccer representatives on that task force and, you know, I have more than confidence that, you know, them along with Richard Groff who is representing the life members there that we

will have great representation and I'm sure they will preserve USASA to where we are today.

So just to let everyone know in the last few months your USASA Board has met twice to go over a strategic plan to strengthen USASA for future years. It's probably one of the most in-depth conversations we've had as a board since I've been president and the one thing that -- some of the things that we talked about and we're going to be working on in the next year, one of the things that we've identified is that we do have many state associations within USASA that are underperforming.

We have to identify who those state associations are and we are in the process of having, number one, a sit-down discussion with those state associations. We are here to help them and to devise a plan that will get those state associations back up and running to the level that they should be at for growth and for continued success with the sport of soccer

in their state.

We need to grow and staying stagnant as a state association with zero growth and continuous flat line results, you know, is not acceptable. I know it's a very hard job to get new members but, you know, we really feel that, you know, some state associations do it and they do a great job doing it and some are just very comfortable where they are and really do not see the need for growth.

So, we will be working with those state associations that we have identified to work on a plan to see if we can get them, you know, a kick start to become a better state association.

We also made a decision that we need to collect data from our state associations and last night the Board of Directors met and we agreed that we changed the policy from seven data points that we need to mirror U.S.

Soccer's data points of ten. There will be some tweaking of that, but we really feel that as USASA we need to know who our membership --

who our members are and, you know, where the membership lies.

Like how many females, how many males, how many over 30s, how many over 40s. We have absolutely no data like that and if we want to secure any type of sponsorships or any type of marketing, those are things they ask for. I mean, if we go to a company and say hey, we have, you know, 150,000 females that, you know, are playing the sport within USASA, it's a lot easier to maybe get a marketing for some female product if they have that data, but if they ask us a question today we cannot provide them any of that data.

So we have Duncan and Cezar working on a plan to deliver to our memberships to help them with the proper data that is needed to get to us. And again, we will assist the members that need assistance to collect this data to get a program that they can get this data directly to USASA properly.

We also have identified that we need sponsors and commercial partners. Duncan and

Brett are working on a plan on how to attract new sponsors and commercial partners to USASA, and just for example, for Soccer Fest we have secured Moe's Southern Grill I believe they're called. And they're going to provide food to the referees and other benefits for our soccer festival.

I also secured Dunkin' Donuts again to give all the participants a gift card to go to their local Dunkin' Donuts in Chattanooga and get some either coffee or whatever they want, so slowly we're working on these small marketing sponsors and, you know, again, in order to get larger and bigger ones, Richard Groff is working on a possible beer sponsor. They want data and we need to get the data into USASA so we know who we are.

We also need to enhance our website and have a better presence on social media and I personally am working with Nick in the office on how we're going to accomplish this. How can we identify and get our members, you know, some good coverage on our website and on

social media. So we're going to be working on a plan on how to enhance our social media platform and our website, so it's a lot better information for our members.

Soccer Fest. As everyone knows, Soccer Fest will be back to its original state,

11 v 11, older small-sided games which will happen the week after the 4th of July in Chattanooga. Registrations are well underway. I believe Duncan reported yesterday that right as of today we have over 50 teams registered for Chattanooga which is ahead of our previous registrations at this time of year, so people are interested, people are signing up and they will be there this year and hopefully we'll have a great Soccer Fest in Chattanooga for them to enjoy.

I also would like to address USASA, something that USASA was aware of and I believe it just was approved by the Board of Directors of U.S. Soccer. One of our largest members, UPSL, the United Premiere Soccer League, has filled out an application to be a

direct member of U.S. Soccer and I believe -I left the room, but I believe it was approved
by the Board of Directors just a half hour
ago.

Now, I will be going onto the floor of the National Council tomorrow where I'm sure they will get approval to be a direct member of U.S. Soccer. What does that mean for USASA? That means we lose 15,000 players that we had registered for us this year.

So, we weren't happy. They never informed us that they were doing this. The way we were -- we got the information when we got the Book of Reports emailed to us. We looked at the agenda and we saw that.

There was an application from the UPSL for direct membership and Duncan when he contacted Graham, who is the owner, at first he was considering having dual membership with us in the Federation, but after further discussion decided to leave USASA totally. So that will be a 15,000 player hit for USASA next year.

So, I think that's an important matter

that all the members should know. So, that's where we are with that.

Let me just finish up. So I want to conclude by just letting the members know a couple of things. First of all, we have decided as a Board of Directors to withdraw the bylaw that we were going to present today at this meeting which was the bylaw to give a —— to remove one of the independent directors' seat and give it directly or give that seat to our other affiliates, other members. We'll call them the at-large group for now for not having a better word.

We really feel that it's -- I feel personally it's extremely important that they do get a seat on the Board of Directors and I have said it at the regional meetings that it would be one seat out of 12 which would not have any impact on how the Board votes, but I feel very strongly that that group of members need to have a voice on our Board of Directors.

So, after further discussion with the

Board we decided that we will pull that bylaw today. We're not going to put it onto the floor. We really feel that it's an issue that is too important to do it virtually with everybody not being present.

So we will bring that bylaw back in September when we will be all together in Denver for our Annual General Meeting, but there will be -- we will withdraw that for today's meeting so that -- I want to have a good process of discussion, vetting through that because it is too important not having our members being represented on the Board.

And as you can see, if we do not treat everyone that is a member with total respect, they will leave us and UPSL is a prime example of that. And you know, the one comment I will make to everyone is, you know, some of you may be saying I'm glad they're leaving, but here's the danger.

At least when they were our member, you know, and I know there was always that controversy that they were taking our team,

but they were still our member and we would not lose those players. So now we've got to be careful because now they're going to continue going after your teams. They're going to take some of your teams and now they're not our members so now we definitely lose completely because of their actions of leaving us.

So there is consequences on decisions we make and that's why I am a true believer that we need to give them representation on our Board of Directors, but that conversation will be had in September where we're all together face to face.

Also, just for your information, there was also an Adult Council bylaw that we had proposed for the Adult Council which -- for U.S. Soccer, excuse me, that we wanted to lower the threshold of the national association from 200,000 players to 150,000 players.

Again, after further discussion, we really feel that, you know, that is not a threshold

that makes any sense. I think what we were trying to do is to see if there would be a way to get more members to be part of the Adult Council and just dropping it from 200,000 to 150, there's no one in the country that would ever beat the 150 threshold so there would never be another member of the Adult Council.

So I have appointed Richard Groff to work with the national leagues and our other affiliates to see what makes sense on how we can all work together, respect each other and give them a seat at the Adult Council.

Again, this is a bigger discussion so we really felt that having that bylaw or just dropping the threshold from 200,000 to 150 absolutely did not make sense, so that will be withdrawn also.

That is all I have got right now. I just came back from the U.S. Soccer Board meeting and I'll save my remarks about what happened there at the Adult Council meeting which will immediately follow this meeting, but I figure that's more of an Adult Council discussion and

we're all going to be there anyway. 1 2 So I want to thank you again for everything you've done. Again, that 220,000 3 was spectacular. Continue the hard work 4 5 you're doing. And with that, do we have the Credentials 6 Report ready? 7 8 MS. PUGLIESE: No. PRESIDENT MOTTA: She's still working. 9 10 So what I will do right now --11 MS. PUGLIESE: I have got the final 12 numbers. 13 PRESIDENT MOTTA: She's got the final 14 numbers so I'll turn it over to Dyann for 15 approval of the Credentials Report. Go ahead, 16 Dyann. MS. PUGLIESE: We have 198 total votes 17 18 entitled. Of those votes 168 are present. 19 50 percent vote would be 84. A 50 percent 20 plus one would be 85. A two-thirds vote is 21 112. Any questions? 22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I accept the 23 credentials report.

MS. PUGLIESE: Is there a second to 1 2 accept the Credentials Report? Anybody? UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: 3 MS. PUGLIESE: Okay. Thank you. 4 5 Credentials Report passes. PRESIDENT MOTTA: Thank you, Dyann, for 6 your hard work. And so we continue. 7 8 So I finished my report so what I'm going to do is turn the chair over to Richard 9 10 Groff. He has a few comments to make also. 11 Your vice president. MR. GROFF: Good afternoon, everyone. 12 13 This is I think my 23rd annual meeting and I 14 have to tell you it's much better when all 300 15 of you are here than trying to do this over the virtual meeting, the Zoom call. I look 16 17 forward to September to do this again. So, what I want to talk about is what John 18 19 mentioned. The UPSL left, 15,000 players, and 20 he appointed me to a committee about a month 21 ago to meet with all of these leagues. There's seven of them and there is three 22 23 affiliates.

The affiliates are like U.S. Club, AYSL and SAY. We did have one meeting. We had excellent discussion. It was remarkable that no one from the UPSL told us that they planned to leave.

So we actually had discussions about the future and we found out they're leaving, we lose those players and what are we going to do? So what the plan is now between now and September, that committee will continue to meet.

We will meet with each of the leagues individually. We will discuss their plans for the future, how they're going to grow, how they are involved with USASA. We will talk to them, what they would like to see change, how they can help us to become a larger organization.

Those meetings will be critical. Each month we will give a report to the Board of Directors. You will hear their side of the argument and that will impact your decisions of how we can move forward and have them

remain as part of our membership.

Certainly we need to grow back to over 220,000 players. U.S. members and state associations have a great deal of responsibility to do that, but I also believe that we need this dialogue with the leagues and with the affiliates so they help us do that and we have a true partnership.

I think it's the right thing to do on the bylaw. Certainly the bylaw that as the Board of Directors was important to some of those leagues, obviously not important to the UPSL. We will now find out what is important so we can give that information back to you.

I look forward to an exciting six months working on this and the Board will get a report every month. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT MOTTA: Okay. Thank you, Richard. Does anyone else have any report to make?

Okay. Seeing none, since we do not have any elections to be done at this meeting, our USASA elections are done during our AGM in

September, and since we have no bylaws to approve or to vote on, you know, the business of this meeting is done.

Just remember we're going to adjourn this one and go into the Adult Council meeting where we do have business to do there. So unless -- so also on our agenda for this meeting we do have Good of the Game.

I'm going to hold off Good of the Game for this meeting and add it to the end of the next meeting. So does anyone have any USASA business that they would like to discuss? I see something in the chat from -- there is a lot of chat stuff.

Tom Moore just sent a message. If the UPSL drops its membership in USASA and you have a UPSL in your state association that is playing in the USASA National Cup, it is no longer able to do so unless they purchase player registrations from your state association.

That is 100 percent correct. So, what we're planning to do in USASA is following the

National Council meeting of U.S. Soccer tomorrow, when they become -- because I don't see any reason why they would be voted against, but when they become a member of U.S. Soccer directly, they will no longer be a member be of USASA.

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They did pay us the \$1000 affiliation fee to be affiliated with us this year. determined as a Board yesterday that if they do get accepted we will return their \$1000 back to them and just -- and what we will need to do is inform, which Tom Moore is 100 percent correct, any team, UPSL team, that is currently playing in any USA Amateur Cup competition should not, and I would hope every state association would abide by this, should tell them they are no longer in our competition because they are not our member, but every state association can have a discussion with those teams and allow them to compete in your competition if they follow whatever state association rules you may have in place to allow other teams to compete into

your state competition.

But that is a decision that every state will have to make. We're not taking a stand on that. Our recommendation is that they're not a member. They should not participate.

But we do respect the state association's desire if they do have teams that they want to still compete. Just ensure for insurance purposes that they do register with your state association because you've got to remember they currently do not have insurance through USASA any longer.

So in order for them to have our insurance, you would have to register that team in whatever form you wish to be in USASA for your state association member.

So I want to be very clear. We do not want them to participate, but we're not taking a hard line. We will let the state associations determine how they want to proceed with their Amateur Cup at the state level and you make that decision.

So with that, I have nothing else for this

meeting. If no one has any other questions for me we can adjourn this meeting and immediately convene the Adult Council meeting.

Is there a motion to adjourn this meeting? You can raise your hand or -- I can't see everybody. Motion to adjourn? Richard made the motion and I see Robin is seconding the motion so this meeting is officially -- hold on.

I see Andy Marion has a question. Go ahead, Andy. You are muted, Andy. Can he speak? Jen, can you please let Andy Marion speak to ask a question.

MS. SUNDERLAND: You've been given permission.

PRESIDENT MOTTA: You gave him permission? He must be on mute. Andy, there you go, Andy. I can hear you.

MR. MARION: I unmuted twice. So just a technical question. Since I believe we are officially ending a meeting of the National Council, should there have been minutes of the previous National Council meeting approved?

PRESIDENT MOTTA: No because what we 1 2 will do is at the AGM in September we will approve the minutes from last year's AGM. 3 That's how we usually do it. And we'll 4 5 probably approve the minutes of this meeting, too. 6 MR. MARION: Okay. If that is the 7 8 normal way. I just wondered meeting to 9 meeting where each meeting we approve since 10 this is an official meeting, but if that's 11 okay. 12 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR RIDDLE: Andy, this 13 is Duncan. This is not our AGM. We only 14 opened this meeting because we thought we were 15 going to have some piece of business which is the bylaw on the independent director. 16 17 MR. MARION: Right. I understand. Ι know it's not the AGM, but it is still an 18 official --19 20 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR RIDDLE: We'll do the 21 AGM minutes in September. 22 PRESIDENT MOTTA: You're right, Andy.

This is an official USASA National Council

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Meeting. You are 100 percent correct. 1 2 when we meet in September we will have last years' AGM minutes and these minutes to 3 4 approve. 5 MR. MARION: Okay. PRESIDENT MOTTA: I believe at the AGM 6 we didn't have a special council -- a special 7 8 National Council meeting last year, so we'll 9 do the two of them at the AGM, Andy. 10 MR. MARION: Thank you. 11 PRESIDENT MOTTA: You're welcome. 12 other questions? 13 Seeing no other questions, this meeting is 14 adjourned. You can stay on. Doesn't mean you 15 have to hang up and re-register. You can just 16 stay on and we will -- I'll give everybody 17 five minutes if you want to go get a water or go to the bathroom. 18 So I'll give everybody five minutes. 19 20 I will start the meeting at 1:00 Eastern time. 21 22 (Meeting adjourned) 23
